Hon'ble Sir,

As you are aware that the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, has issued the Plastic Waste Management Amendment Rules, 2021, on 12th August 2021, which specifically target single-use plastic items with low utility and high littering potential. Furthermore, MCD has recently notified the Plastic Waste Management Byelaws 2024 on 23rd January 2024 to reinforce these regulations.

Recognizing the importance of raising awareness and fostering behavior change to effectively tackle plastic pollution, MCD has initiated the "100 Days to Beat Plastic Campaign 2.0" on 31st January 2024, scheduled to culminate on World Environment Day, 5th June 2024. As part of this campaign, a "Students Vs. Plastics" Toolkit has been introduced in collaboration with the Why Waste Wednesdays Foundation and Earth Day Network India. This toolkit is designed to engage students across educational institutions, including schools, colleges, universities, and vocational institutes, within the jurisdiction of MCD.

I am pleased to share with you the launch of the "Students Vs. Plastics" toolkit, which aims to empower students to actively participate in the fight against single-use plastic. The toolkit provides comprehensive guidance, from registration to participation in activities, progress tracking, and earning awards. Attached herewith is a copy of the toolkit in Hindi and English for your reference.

सिंगल यूज़ प्लास्टिक की समस्या। :

दिल्ली राज्य एक बड़ी समस्या का सामना कर रहा है, रोजाना भारी 11,500 टन के कचरे का निर्माण हो रहा है। इसमें चौंकाने वाली बात यह है कि 10% कचरा प्लास्टिक है, और उसमें से बड़ा हिस्सा (550 टन) एक बार का उपयोग वाला प्लास्टिक आइटम है।

वैश्विक स्तर पर, हर मिनट, हम एक मिलियन प्लास्टिक बोतलें खरीदते हैं। और केवल विश्व में उत्पन्न होने वाले प्लास्टिक में से 9% प्लास्टिक को पुनःस्थापित (रीसायकल) किया जाता है। यह पृथ्वी के लिए बिलकुल अच्छा नहीं है और एक खतरा बनता जा रहा है।

इस टूलकिट का यह सही समय है। यह एक प्लास्टिक समस्या का सामना करने के लिए एक सुपरहीरो मिशन की तरह है। कल्पना करो, केवल प्लास्टिक बैग की बजाय एक कपड़े के बैग का उपयोग करके, तुम अपने पूरे जीवन में 20,000 से 40,000 प्लास्टिक बैग बचा रहे हो। और यह बस एक व्यक्ति है।

क्या तुम जानते हो कि हम हर साल लगभग 80 से 100 प्लास्टिक बोतलों से पानी पीते हैं? हैरानी की बात है, ना? लेकिन एक रेयुसेबल बोतल का उपयोग करने से यह सभी प्लास्टिक कचरे को बचाया सकता है।

अब, चलो उन छोटी-छोटी चीजों के बारे में बात करते हैं जैसे कि स्ट्रॉ और कॉफी कप्स। यदि तुम हर दिन एक प्लास्टिक स्ट्रॉ का उपयोग बंद करते हो, तो इससे एक साल में 365 स्ट्रॉ बचते हैं। और एक पुनःस्थानीय कॉफी कप चुनना? यह वार्षिक रूप से 80 से 100 डिस्पोजेबल कप्स से इनकार करने के समान है।

यह टूलकिट हर किसी को हीरो बनने के लिए एक गाइडबुक की तरह है। यह दिखाता है कि तुम्हारे रोजमर्रा के चयन से हम जो प्लास्टिक की समस्या का सामना कर रहे हैं, उसमें कैसे एक बड़ा अंतर लाया जा सकता है।

तो, छोटे बदलाव करके, हम सिर्फ दिल्ली की मदद नहीं कर रहे हैं; हम हमारी प्लैनेटम, हमारी धरती मा को खुश और स्वस्थ रखने के लिए विश्वभर के एक टीम का हिस्सा हैं।

टूलकिट की तर्कसंगतता इन भयंकर आंकड़ों के सामने स्पष्ट हो जाती है। एक सक्रिय स्थिति अवलंबन करते हुए, यह व्यक्तिगत चयनों के प्रभाव को हाइलाइट करके मूल कारणों का सामना करने का प्रयास करता है।

Delhi deals with a massive trash issue, making a whopping 11,500 tons of garbage every day of which 10% is plastic. Shockingly, 50% of this plastic (550 tons), is one-time-use plastic things.

Now, think about this: on a global scale, every single minute, we buy a million plastic bottles! And guess what? Only 9% of all plastic generated globally gets recycled. That's not great for the planet.

Here's where this toolkit makes sense. It's like this superhero mission to tackle the plastic problem. Imagine, just by using one cloth bag instead of a plastic one, you're saving as many as 20,000 to 40,000 plastic bags in your whole life. And that's just one person!

Did you know we drink from about 80 to 100 plastic bottles every year? Crazy, right? But using a reusable water bottle instead can save all that plastic waste.

Now, let's talk about those tiny things like straws and coffee cups. If you stop using a plastic straw every day, that adds up to 365 straws saved in a year.
